




7 The people who park on both sides of the road, it makes it very tricky to get through with the cars coming the opposite way. They take up a bit of room.




New paths and upgrades






Perth-Peel Long Term Cycle Network

Regional Long Term Cycle Networks



New bike network grants to focus on public transport connections

The Western Australian Bicycle Network (WABN) Grants Program has undergone a refresh to better deliver on the State Government's priorities aligned to the long-term cycle network for Perth, Peel and across our regions.

- Government announces updated Western Australian Bicycle Network Grants Program
- Grants program will be split across metropolitan and regional streams
- Metro stream will focus on projects within two kilometres of METRONET stations
- The regional stream of the program will continue unchanged
- The revised grants program will now consider a four-year program period to help facilitate higher value
- First grant round under new program expected to open in July 2024

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
The program will continue to be delivered in two streams across metropolitan Perth and regional WA.

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

The cycle network the government plans to take the pressure off Perth's roads could take more than 100 years to complete at its current rate, new modelling shows.

Advocacy body WestCycle has released its calculations as part of its election bid for the government to reallocate some of its road funding to complete the network in a decade.

WHY IT MATTERS

- Cars are dangerous. WA had its secondworst road toll in 10 years in 2024 with 185 people killed in crashes.
- Cars are expensive. The AAA estimates Australians spend 17 per cent of their income on transport, 92 per cent of that on cars.
- Cars are polluting. Transport is Australia's third-largest source of greenhouse gas emissions and half of that is car emissions.
- Despite this government's record investment, cycling infrastructure is just 2 per cent of WA's transport budget. The UN recommends 20 per cent.
- Even though some will never be able to or want to cycle, less driving helps everyone, including other drivers, who hanafit from the reduced traffic
